SCHOOL TARGETS AND STRATEGIES

Mathematics: In the 2018 - 2019 school year, Running Brook Elementary will increase the number of students performing at a proficient level on PARCC from 31% to 34.3%. The percentage of African American students performing at a proficient level will increase from 19% to 24%. Our math support teacher will deliver monthly professional learning to our instructional staff focused on computational strategies and content standards. All teachers and instructional staff will also take part in monthly data discussions to monitor the progress of our students.

Literacy: In the 2018 -2019 school year, Running Brook Elementary will increase the number of students performing at a proficient level on PARCC from 31.7% to 40.7%. The percentage of African American students performing at a proficient level will increase from 19.7% to 28.9%. Our reading support teacher will deliver monthly professional learning to our instructional staff focused on student engagement and the implementation of daily writing instruction. All teachers and instructional staff will also take part in monthly data discussions to monitor the progress of our students.

Suspensions: In the 2018 -2019 school year, Running Brook Elementary will decrease the number of suspensions from 22 to 18. The number of suspensions for African American students will decrease from 18 to 16. Each grade level will have daily social emotional learning. Staff will take part in social emotional professional learning to learn how to effectively use community circles for conflict resolution. Our administrative team will facilitate monthly data discussions with all teachers and instructional staff focused on our office referral data and suspensions.
