MATH MINUTES WITH MRS. MANGUS

Are you watching the Winter Olympics? If so, be on the lookout for multiple opportunities to talk about math with your family!

You can:

- Compare the number of medals that each country wins
- Round times/scores to the nearest whole number
- Find the difference between a competitor's best and worst score
- Talk about measurement in events such as the biathlon How many meters would each event be?
- In sports like snowboarding, talk about how many circles these moves are: 180, 360, 540, 720, 1260

All students are encouraged to solve the monthly problem at home and use modeling to show how they came up with their answer, or explain how to solve the problem to someone else using a mathematical model. Some students may also have their work featured on the morning announcements. In addition, students who complete the Panther Problem Solvers activity will be entered into a prize drawing. Students who complete the Panther Problem Solver activity should turn their work into their math teacher or to Mrs. Mangus.

It's almost time to register for Kindergarten! Kindergarten and new First Grader registration will take place beginning on March 5, 2018 through March 9, 2018. Please stop into the Running Brook Elementary School front office between the hours of 10:00am and 3:00pm, no appointment necessary. Kindergarten is mandatory in Maryland. State law requires that children entering Kindergarten in the fall of 2018 must be 5 years of age on or

before September 1, 2018. Children entering first grade in the fall of 2018 must be 6 years old on or before September 1, 2018. For information about exceptions to this law (e.g. waiver, early admission) visit <u>http://www.hcpss.org/enroll/kindergarten/</u>.

A Parent or Guardian Must Present the Following Information at the Time of Registration:

- The child's evidence of birth (i.e. birth certificate)
- An authorized record of immunization
- Proof of residency in the form of a current/complete lease or deed
- A utility bill in the parent/guardian name
- Photo ID of the parent/guardian
- Proof of custody

State law prohibits a child from attending school for even one day unless proof of immunization has been provided. Immunization and health forms are available at each elementary school. Families who require interpreter services can contact the Office of International Student Services at 410-313-1525 or 410-313-7102 for registration assistance.

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Save The Date...

Prek REGISTRATION: OPENS MARCH 5, 2018

What is the Pre-K program? The Pre-K program is a highquality, full-day prekindergarten program. Students must be four years old by September 1, 2018 to be considered for enrollment. The curriculum supports early learning and school readiness, as well as provides experiences that foster children's academic, social, emotional and physical development.

Is my child eligible for the program?

Per Maryland regulations, Pre-K is provided to any child who meets first priority criteria, which includes income eligibility, homelessness, and foster care. When space allows, as determined by countywide enrollment projections, additional children who meet second priority criteria (i.e. English Language Learners, health concerns, learning difficulties) may be enrolled.

How do I apply?

2018-19 Pre-K applications will be available beginning March 5th. Once available, applications may be downloaded from http://www.hcpss.org/schools/pre-k-programs/ or picked up at your districted school - no appointment necessary. Applications should be submitted to the Pre-K site that serves your attendance area. All application information will be kept confidential and reviewed only by school staff. The school will review applications and then invite students to be enrolled according to the criteria described above. If your child is invited into the program you will need to register (please see Kindergarten registration for the documents needed).
